Antonio Najarro, through the classic spanish dance fused with new trends both in music and dance, brings to life a new choreography with some forms of expression that characterize and govern his personal style as a creator.



This time he has based his choreographic concept on the extraordinary original score by Rafael Riqueni, one of the most important spanish composers of our times with the collaboration of Miguel Rivera. The musical adaptation of the work has been done by Omar Acosta and Arturo Tamayo.

Rafael Riqueni's score reflects tradition, yearning and nostalgia. The flamenco guitars converge with the rest of flamenco and orchestra ins-

truments, describing Andalusian customs and landscapes in a variety of different choreographic movements.

Antonio Najarro wanted to contrast the classicism that emerges from the musical composition with the contemporary vision of Spanish dance itself, ranging from traditional flamenco dance school virtuosity to the stylist and most intimate flamenco.







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FLAMENCO PASSION

Flamenco is a popular, non written music that has been passed orally from generation to generation, in spite of the lack of a musical education of its performers. It could probably be said that the source of the flamenco's mysterious appeal reflects just a way of thinking, different perhaps, but extraordinarily natural and intuitive. Because of its intensity and the richness of its content, it has been the font of inspiration for many european composers as well as many writers.



Within the remarkable diversity of theoretical views on the origin of flamenco, pure speculation and even sheer fantasy have often proven to be serviceable sources. All we can say with certainty is that flamenco song and dance reflect elements of the discrete cultures that coexisted in 15th century Andalucia, at the time of the arrival of the gypsies in Spain.



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FLAMENCO PASSION

To this mixture of cultures – Andalusian, Arabic- the gypsies brought forms of their own. Flamenco is the result of this process of reciprocal influence.

The show to be presented will express all the passion and wildness of flamenco singing and dance as a medium for communicating deep feelings. For that reason the performer's inspiration is essential. Even more important than any other consideration is the performer's spontaneous improvisations, which in turn yield those ineffable magic moments of rapture.





As a result, instinct and emotions take precedence over any kind of technique. Thus, those unbelievable haunting moments that cannot be rehearsed, anticipated or faked.





The flamenco dress is used by flamenco dancers during their performances. It is the most distinctive and colorful element of flamenco. It is a fitted long dress reaching to the ankle and is adorned with several "ruffles" that are placed on both the skirt and sleeves. It is made in bright colors in both plain and patterned designs. Flamenco dress is often complemented by a shawl that rests on the shoulders.

The suit initially used by gypsy women has become popular as it is the common costume used to attend the fairs held in many towns in Andalusia.

The origin of the outfit goes back to the late nineteenth and early twentieth century, when the vendors came to the fair with livestock dealers dressed in typical modest gowns adorned with ruffles.

Afterwards, the wealthy classes copied the dress of the field workers. From the April Fair held in Seville in the year 1929, the suit was consecrated as the official dress to attend the event, a tradition that has continued until today.


The flamenco dress has not remained constant over time, it has undergone changes in the fashion over the years. Thus, in the 60s and 70s of the last century, its dimensions were shortened to half a leg or knee.


We propose to present within the framework of the Festival a Flamenco dresses fashion show to raise awareness among qatary people of this typical andalusian art and tradition.



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FLAMENCO GUITAR AND DANCE WORKSHOPS


The Arab music is one of the most important forms of expression of the Arab civilization. The first Arab dynasty in Spain arrived with their own cultural baggage that eventually lit up the whole modal system of andalusian music.

After eight centuries of the Arab presence in Spain in general and Andalucia in particular, the Arab musical heritage played a very important role in the formation of the flamenco music and dance. Flamenco scholars have recognized the Arab influence in the birth of the art of flamenco, mainly because both Arab and flamenco music are melismatic.

What we pretend with the organization of these workshops is to emphasize and potentiate local Arab roots that have a deep similarity with those of flamenco. It is the modern fusion of two cultures and two ways of conceiving music and dance in a globalized world.

The workshops will be organized during the whole week of the Festival. Dancing will be restricted to women.





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
